



We are looking a couple of alternatives and hope to have something finalized in the next couple of months.

As mentioned in the previous newsletter we are proceeding with installing address signs on each and every property. We have selected a supplier and are in the process of finalizing our contract with this supplier.

We also did not have any road work completed in 2017 as our contractor ran out of time with the very heavy rains in the Spring and early summer. We are very high on his priority list and will be one of the first to receive service in 2018. The priority is to establish a longer range plan to maintain and improve the road system. The prime contractor is to be contacted shortly to review the work required for this year and establish a longer range plan.

All councilors have completed the mandatory training with respect to the New Municipal Government Act. Under the act we have to complete a number of activities in 2018 and as such we are in the process of applying for a Grant to hire a consultant to work with the CAO and Council to ensure we meet the new requirements. Part of the work to be completed is to renew our Land Use Bylaw.

We will be having an information session and Open house July 7, 2018 at 10:00 AM at the New Seniors Drop-In Centre.

Off Highway Vehicle Helmet Law Enacted May 15, 2017

In Alberta, an off-highway vehicle (OHV) is defined in the *Traffic Safety Act* as any motorized mode of transportation built for cross-country travel on land, water, snow, ice or marsh or swamp land or on other natural terrain, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, includes, when specifically designed for such travel,

- 4-wheel drive vehicles,
- low pressure tire vehicles,
- motorcycles and related 2-wheel vehicles,
- amphibious vehicles,
- all-terrain vehicles (ATVs),
- utility terrain vehicles,
- miniature motor vehicles,
- snow vehicles,
- minibikes, and
- any other means of motorized transportation.

This definition includes OHVs known as side-by-sides, dirt bikes, snowmobiles and snow bikes.

Helmets would be required for anyone driving, operating, riding in or on, or being towed by, an OHV on public land including roadways.
